



Silver	1. The city received a grant and it decided to use part of the money to purchase a Vactor compressed natural gas (cng) truck which is used to clean sewer lines. Silver	1. The city is proposing to redevelop two vacant lots where an Imax theater was in order to put in a two-block festival corridor in the downtown area.
