Why Target the Public Sector Service?

- Need for more diverse workforce to reflect community
- Baby boomer retirements
- Local governments offer a wide range of career paths.
- Civic engagement is problematic:
 - The United States ranks 139th in voter participation of 172 democracies around the world.
 - Less than 8% of registered 18-24 year-olds actually voted in the 2014 primary election.
 - 55% of all youth ages 12-18 volunteer; less for youth of color.

Goals for the Governments Engaging Youth program

- Create a high school to career pipeline to ensure a more diverse and prepared public sector workforce.
- Students learn 21st century workforce skills.
- Students learn how to become active citizens.
- Increase youth knowledge of how local government operates.
- Strengthen intergenerational relationships and improve adult knowledge of youth.

Program Description

The City of West Sacramento has established a paid student summer internship program to provide students with practical work experience related to their academic major or chosen field of study. This program provides the City with the opportunity to invest in our future workforce and demonstrate how students can have the career they want in local government while serving their community.

The eight-week internship will provide interns with positive examples of public service, hands on experience, and an insight into how city governments are run.

Interns will spend time job shadowing City employees. Assignments will be based on the level of experience and the department to which they are assigned.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to be eligible to participate in the Program, the intern must:

- Be a high school junior or senior 16 years of age or older OR be enrolled in an accredited college/university or a graduating high school senior enrolled in an accredited college/university
- Be able to work in the US
- Submit an official City application form
- Priority will be given to Washington Unified School District (WUSD) students who are enrolled in a career-driven pathway or academy. Secondary preference will also be given to other Washington Unified School District students and graduates, and West Sacramento residents.


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

Criteria

To earn this badge, complete the following XPs:

- Transportation Research and Analysis: Assist staff with project-specific research and analysis. This may include document review, data collection, project site visit(s), research, and project document preparation.
- Community Participation in Transportation: Learn about local government and leadership through attendance at one or more local Commission meetings, and participate in the development and facilitation of Community Engagement and Public Outreach activities related to specific transportation projects.
- Municipal Public Works Experience: Gain real-world experience assisting citizens with
 questions at the Public Works Department Counter. Learn about use of GIS applications and
 technical traffic engineering equipment in the field.
- Public Works Administrative Support: Experience working in a professional office setting and apply skills using software such as Microsoft Word and Excel.
- Professional Development in Transportation: Attend one or more transportation focused professional organization meetings or events and shadow a transportation professional for a day.
- Transportation Project: Complete a professional activity binder that represents all of the
 projects and assignments completed over the course of your internship, including community
 participation, and professional development activities.
- · Complete a final evaluation with the department representative

- Assessed national college and career competencies to develop primary attributes for each skill
- Convened Digital Badging Advisory group in August 2015
- Assessment consultant developed ten assessments
- Built assessments in LaunchPath
- Developed design, description and criteria of 21st Century Skills badges
- Trained instructors in August 2016
- Assessments and badges launched early September 2016
- Currently working on the ability for an employer to verify badges
