Purchasing Fuel-Efficient and Alternative-Fuel Vehicles through the California Department of General Services

Introduction

The California Department of General Services (DGS) maintains master contracts for vehicles that local agencies can use to purchase fuel efficient and alternative fuel vehicles at lower prices than may be available otherwise. DGS awards master vehicle contracts to individual dealerships for specific models of vehicles within a general class of vehicles, such as hybrid sedans.

Local agencies can order vehicles directly from selected dealerships under the DGS master vehicle contracts. The DGS website contains all the information necessary for local agencies to find vehicles and dealerships that are included in the contracts. Information about using the DGS website to purchase vehicles is provided below.

Understanding How DGS Selects Dealers and Specifications under Its Contracting Process

How Does DGS Award Master Vehicle Contracts?

DGS awards master vehicle contracts to individual dealerships through a competitive bidding process. DGS begins by publishing specifications for different types or classes of vehicles, such as hybrid sedans. Dealerships then submit bids for contracts to provide a specific model of vehicle for a particular class. DGS then awards contracts to winning dealerships for the model of vehicle they proposed for that class. DGS awards two contracts for each class of vehicles, one specifying delivery of vehicles to any agency within Sacramento County, and the other specifying delivery to any agency within Los Angeles County, in order to offer northern and southern California delivery opportunities.

Does DGS Charge a Fee for Local Agencies to Purchase Vehicles Using the DGS Master Contracts?

Beginning with 2011 model vehicles, DGS will no longer charge local agencies a fee for using DGS master contracts.

Can City or County Agencies Order from Local Dealers Using the DGS Master Vehicle Contracts?

Generally, no. Because DGS awards master vehicle contracts through a competitive bidding process, those contracts only apply to the dealerships that have been awarded the contract. However, all contract specifications and vehicle pricing information are publicly available

through the DGS website. Local agencies may use this information as a starting point for exploring purchasing opportunities with local dealerships.

One issue to consider when evaluating the cost-effectiveness of purchasing vehicles through a DGS master contract is the cost to the local agency of transporting the vehicles from the DGS-contracted dealership to the local agency. Although the dealership with which DGS has the master contract may offer a lower purchase price, that price assumes delivery of the vehicles within either Sacramento County or Los Angeles County. Local agencies outside those two counties will need to negotiate delivery terms with the dealerships. Thus, transporting the vehicle from the dealership could add additional costs to the total purchase price, such as for vehicle transport services, gasoline, or personnel time.

How Does DGS Add Vehicles or Specifications to the List of Master Vehicle Contracts?

Under DGS master vehicle contracts, particular models of vehicles become available for purchase through competitive bidding, within the specifications for a given type or class of vehicles, such as hybrid sedans. Questions or suggestions regarding the specifications for a particular master vehicle contract, such as adding a new class of vehicle or proposing different specifications, may be directed to the state contract administrator for that contract. Contact information for state contract administrators is included on the state contracts index listing on the DGS website (see below).

Using the DGS Web Site

Finding master vehicle contracts for fuel efficient and alternative fuel vehicles through the DGS Web site involves four basic steps.

Step 1: Visit the State Contracts Index Listing

The State Contracts Index Listing lists all state contracts managed by DGS, including vehicle contracts. You can access the listing two ways.

Step 2: Find and Access the Appropriate Statewide Commodity Contract

Contracts are listed in alphabetical order by "Commodity/Service Description." Scroll down the page until you find the appropriate contract, such as:

Click on the "Current Contract" number to the right of the description to access the contract documents on the BidSync Web site.

Step 3: Review the Contract Documents

The BidSync Web site (Figure 3) displays general information about the contract, along with Contract Documents and Contract Attachments. The general contract information at the top of the page includes contact information for the State Contract Administrator at DGS who is managing that contract.

Key documents to review are:

• User Instructions

This attachment lists the rights and responsibilities of the ordering agency under the contract and provides details regarding the ordering process.

• Attachment A – Contract Pricing

This attachment lists the basic information about each vehicle included in the master vehicle contract, such as the Contract Line Item number, the selected Dealer and contact information, a description of the vehicle, and pricing.

• The Order Cut-off Dates document

This document lists the last dates that dealerships can take orders for a particular vehicle in a given year. **NOTE**: This information may change during the course of a year due to changes in availability of specific vehicles, so it is important to verify the information with each dealer when discussing potential orders.

Step 4: Ordering Vehicles

Local agencies can place orders directly with individual dealerships that have master vehicle contracts. Contact information for the dealership is included on the BidSync Web site contract information page. Local agencies should contact the dealership to determine what the dealership needs to process an order.





Figure 2: State Contracts Index Listing:




Figure 3: BidSync Web site contract information page
