The city adopted an Expanded Polystyrene (EPS) ban at all food establishments that went into effect April, 2016. Solana Beach also partnered with the Surfrider Foundation to promote and support its Ocean Friendly Restaurant campaign. The intent is to have local food establishments move to a recyclable, reusable or compostable food container and eliminate EPS materials (<a href="https://sandiego.surfrider.org/ofr/">https://sandiego.surfrider.org/ofr/</a>).</li> </ol>	<p>2015</p> <p>2016</p>
