

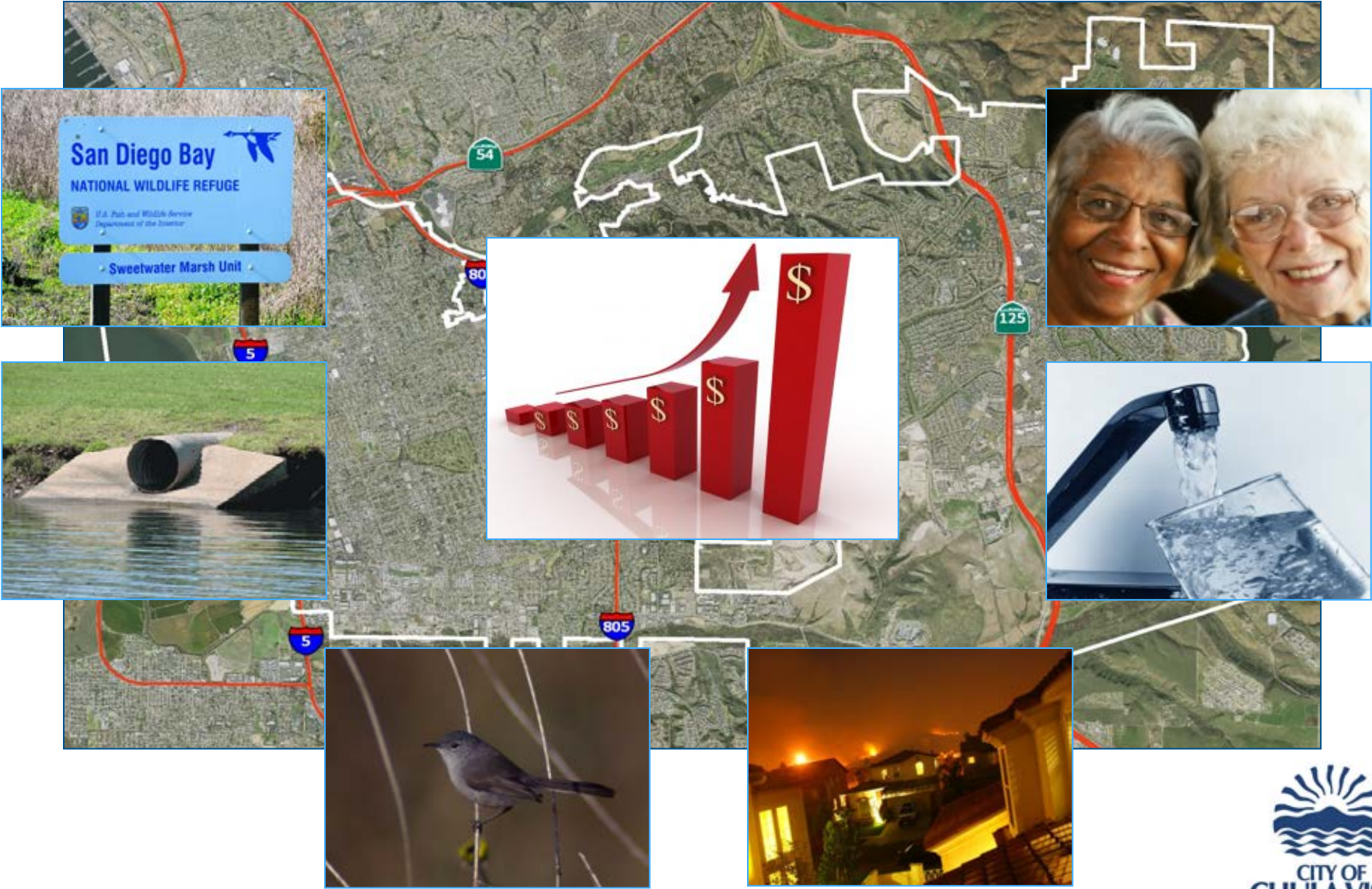

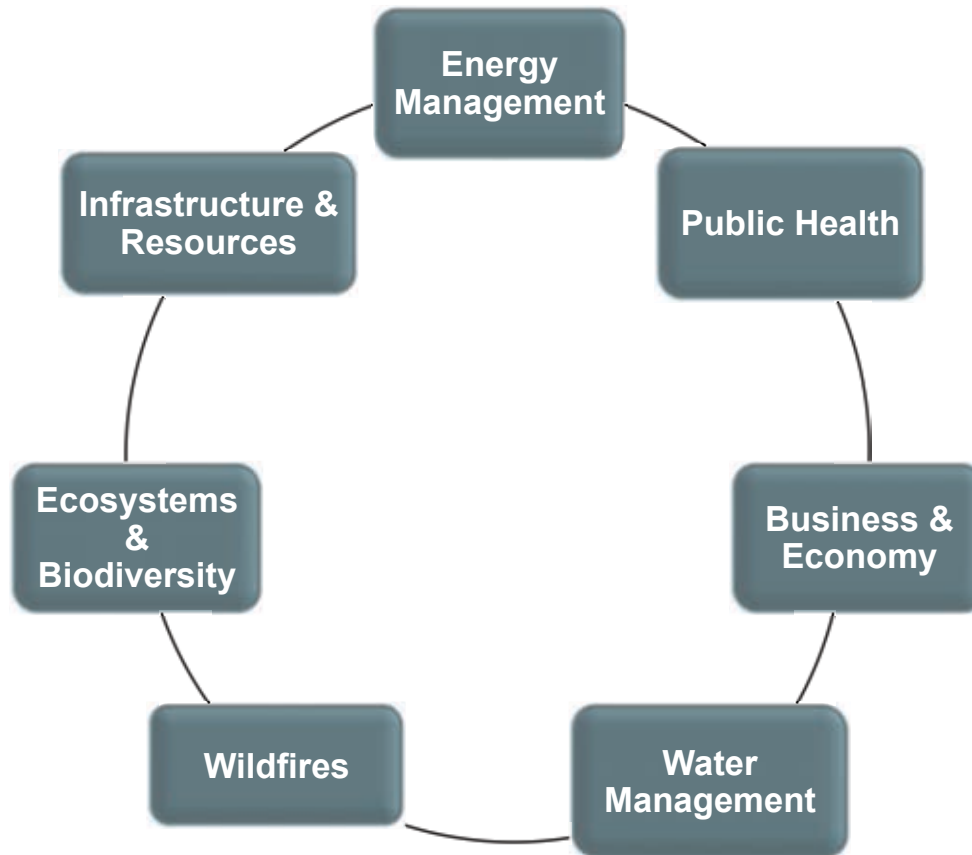

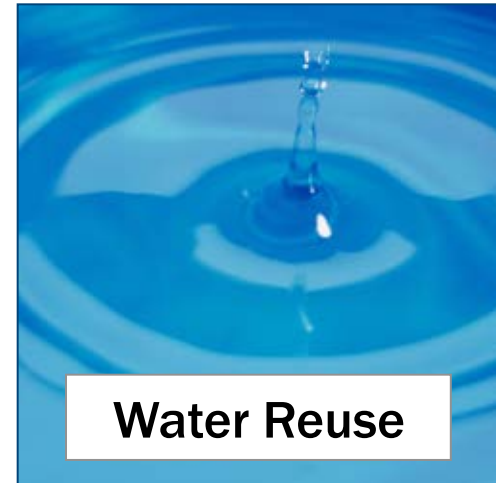
Climate Adaptation Planning

- Review of “risk” & potential adaptation strategies

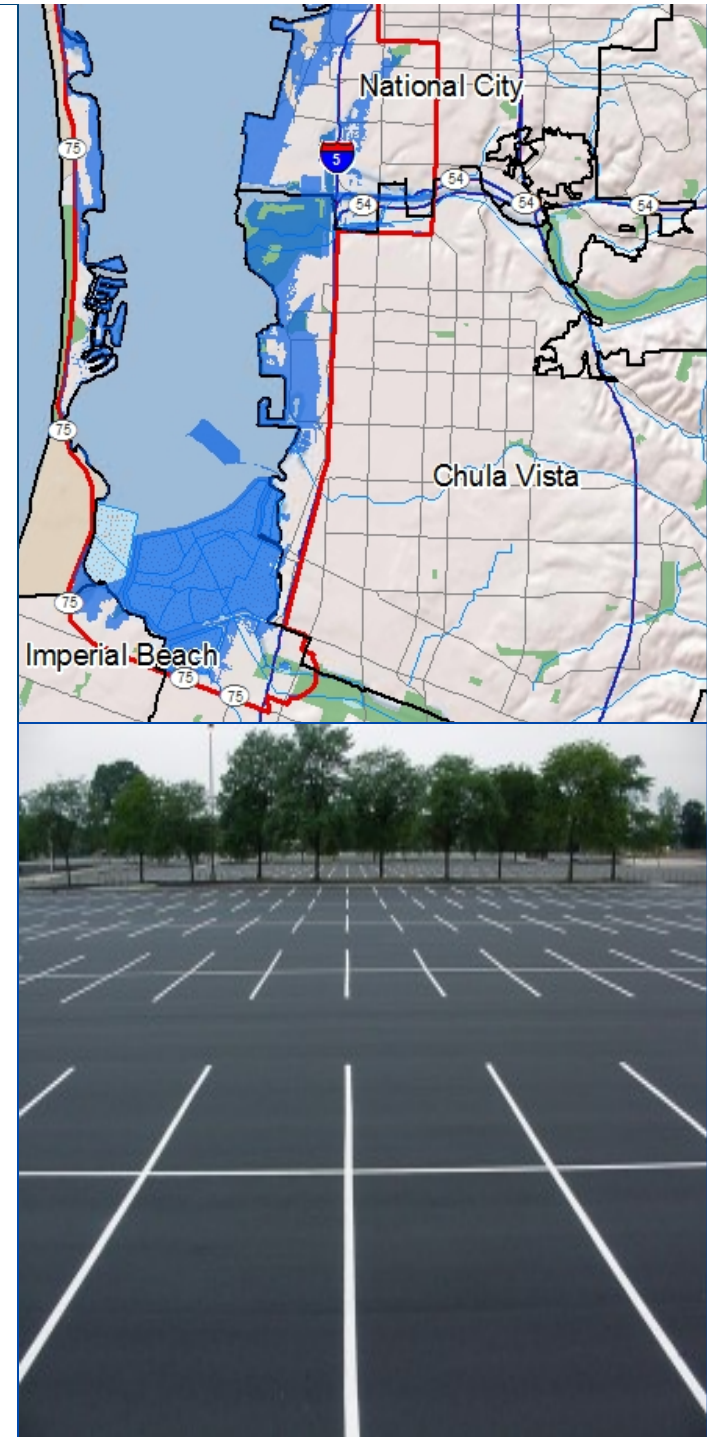


Climate Adaptation Strategies



Initial Implementation

- *Grading Ordinance*
Accommodate 50 yrs of SLR
- *Emergency Operations Plan*
Extreme weather component
- *Shade Tree Policy*
50% shade cover in parking lots
- *Housing Element (draft)*
Resilient design & construction
- *Public Education & Outreach*
Air quality alerts

Lessons Learned

- Need City Leader champions!
- Stress preparedness, lower risk, & co-benefits
- Leverage existing plans, programs, & policies
- Work regionally to share resources & best practices

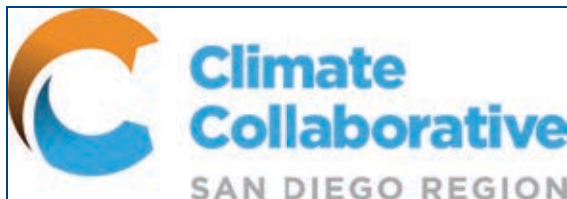
