Why It's Important

Since energy is used to deliver water and wastewater services, using these systems more efficiently reduces energy use. Climate change is anticipated to increase instances of drought and extreme weather events, such as heavy rain and storms, floods and reduced snow pack, all of which effect water availability. Thus, efforts to conserve and use water more efficiently will help cities and counties adapt to the impacts of climate change.

[Smart Irrigation Technology: Three Communities, Three Experiences](#) Three California communities, Simi Valley, Santa Clarita and Woodland, use smart irrigation technology and shared their experiences and lessons learned.

What Other Beacon Award Communities Are Doing

- The [City of West Sacramento's](#) Parks Department has undertaken a mulch program in planter areas, thereby reducing the need to water, helping curb urban runoff water pollution and reducing the need for mechanical weed control, saving labor and administrative costs.
- The [City of Riverside](#) adopted a [Water Recycling Master Plan](#). Phase One is anticipated to connect ten local schools and parks to connect into the recycled water system, saving 8,600 acre feet of water per year, enough to supply 17,000 homes.
- The [City of La Mesa](#) implemented a [Fats, Oils, and Grease \(FOG\) Control Program](#) to help reduce blockages within the wastewater system which can lead to overflows and impact surface water quality.

Water & Wastewater: Promoting Community & Individual Action

Local agencies are undertaking a variety of activities to promote community and individual action related to water and wastewater.

[Manhattan Beach](#) and [Glendale](#) encourage residents to conserve water by providing free classes about water-smart irrigation and water-efficient plants. Manhattan Beach also provides free landscape audits for residents that help identify opportunities to convert traditional gardens to California-friendly, drought-tolerant landscaping.

[The City of Sacramento's](#) Water Wise Garden includes native and drought-tolerant plants, low-volume irrigation, mulch and other water-saving features. Educational signage provides tips on ways residents can implement water-efficient practices while still maintaining a beautiful landscape. The [Water Wise Garden](#) is 44 percent more water efficient than the previous landscaping at the site and is open to the public year-round for viewing.
