Webinar: AB 1661 Sexual Harassment Prevention Training



We are partnering with the League of California Cities on aAB 1661 Sexual Harassment Prevention Training Webinar. AB 1661 requires local agency officials to receive two hours of sexual harassment prevention training and education within the first six months of taking office and every two years thereafter if the agency provides any type of compensation, salary or stipend to those officials. Webinar attendees must be present at a computer to participate, and confirmation of active participation will be determined by answering a series of questions via email following the webinar. Each attendee must have an individual registration in order to receive a certificate of completion.
