1. El Centro is a member of the Imperial Irrigation District (IID), which offers online do-it-yourself energy audits for residential customers free of charge to identify energy-saving opportunities tailored to their homes.

Water & Wastewater Systems Activities

1. The city has Sewer and Water Master Plans that evaluate development projects' water and sewer needs and the impacts of those needs on the city's water and sewer systems. The city updates the plan as necessary and evaluates the need for additional piping capacity.

1. El Centro has ten facilities with green building certifications through the U.S. Green Building Council.

Waste Reduction and Recycling Activities

Silver

1. El Centro is a member of the Imperial Valley Resource Management Agency (IVRMA), who assists the city in developing and implementing sustainable programs for waste reduction, reuse, and recycling. IVRMA also assists in developing and implementing programs for hazardous waste management, composting and recycled -content purchasing for El Centro citizens.

Renewable Energy and Low-Carbon Fuels Activities

Silver 1. El Centro has a fully operational 150-megawatt solar plant that supplies energy to San Diego Gas & Electric under a 25-year power purchase agreement. The plan generates enough electricity to power approximately 55,000 homes.

 1. In February 2019, the El Centro City Council adopted an Active Transportation Plan/Safe Routes to School Plan. The plan aims to improve non-motorized transportation, promote public health, reduce automobile usage and promote transportation equity.

 El Centro's 2050 Vision Plan has eight strategies that address its goal of creating a bustling downtown with a mixture of land uses that celebrates the city's history and heritage. Doing so results in enhanced business development, improved quality of life for residents, increased choices for shopping, housing, work and recreational opportunities.

Open Space and Offsetting Carbon Emission Activities

 The city's Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan has strategies to "embrace the desert" by creating an Environmental Education Program for youths to understand the unique value of Desert Habitat, creating a Desert Demonstration Garden to highlight and adapt drought-tolerant desert plant material and creating policies that demand new developments to adhere to Best Management Practices and consider solar and geothermal power.

1. The City of El Centro held an International Water Safety Day in May 2020. The purpose of the event was to raise awareness about water safety education and drowning prevention. The city gave out free at-home water safety activity kits and the first 40 kids registered were sponsored by the Fraternal Order of Eagles.
