She also served as a Chief Deputy in the Sonoma County Counsel's Office, and under Governor Jerry Brown as a lead prosecutor at the Agricultural Labor Relations Board and enforced farmworker labor rights. She also serves as a Board Trustee, representing Area 3, for the Santa Rosa City School District.
