WHAT DO WE MEAN BY PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT?

Civic Engagement

- Involvement in civic and political life of their community

Public Information / Outreach

- One-way local government communication to inform – may be no-cost or low-cost

Marketing / Advertising

- Promotional messages disseminated across communications channels to inform – often paid

Public Engagement

- A broad range of methods to inform *and* gather input (two-way communication using a variety of channels)

Ensuring reach is focused to include traditionally marginalized communities

Accessible

Overcoming the unique challenges from the community

Dialogue

Ensuring two-way communication

Culturally Competent

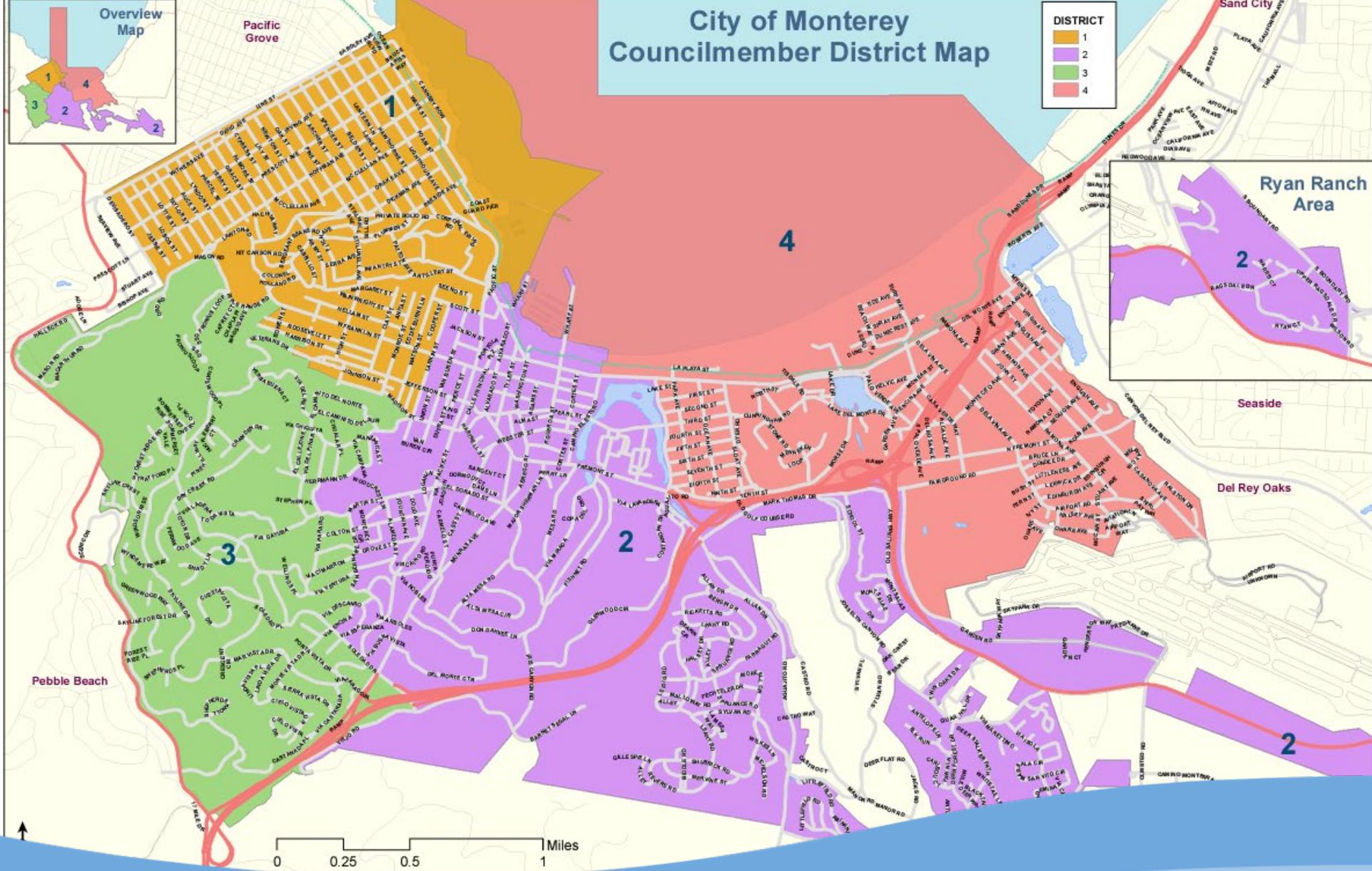

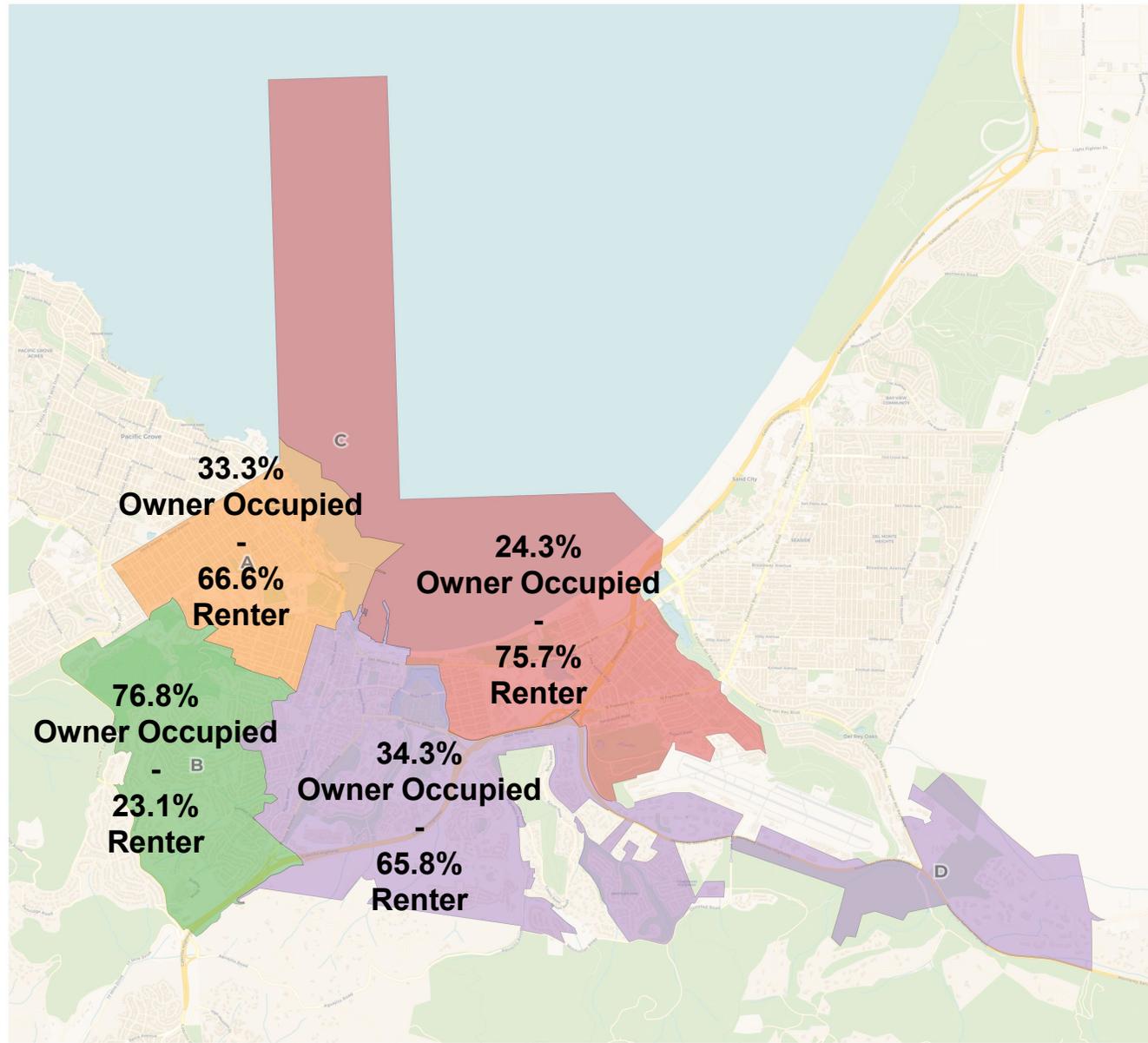

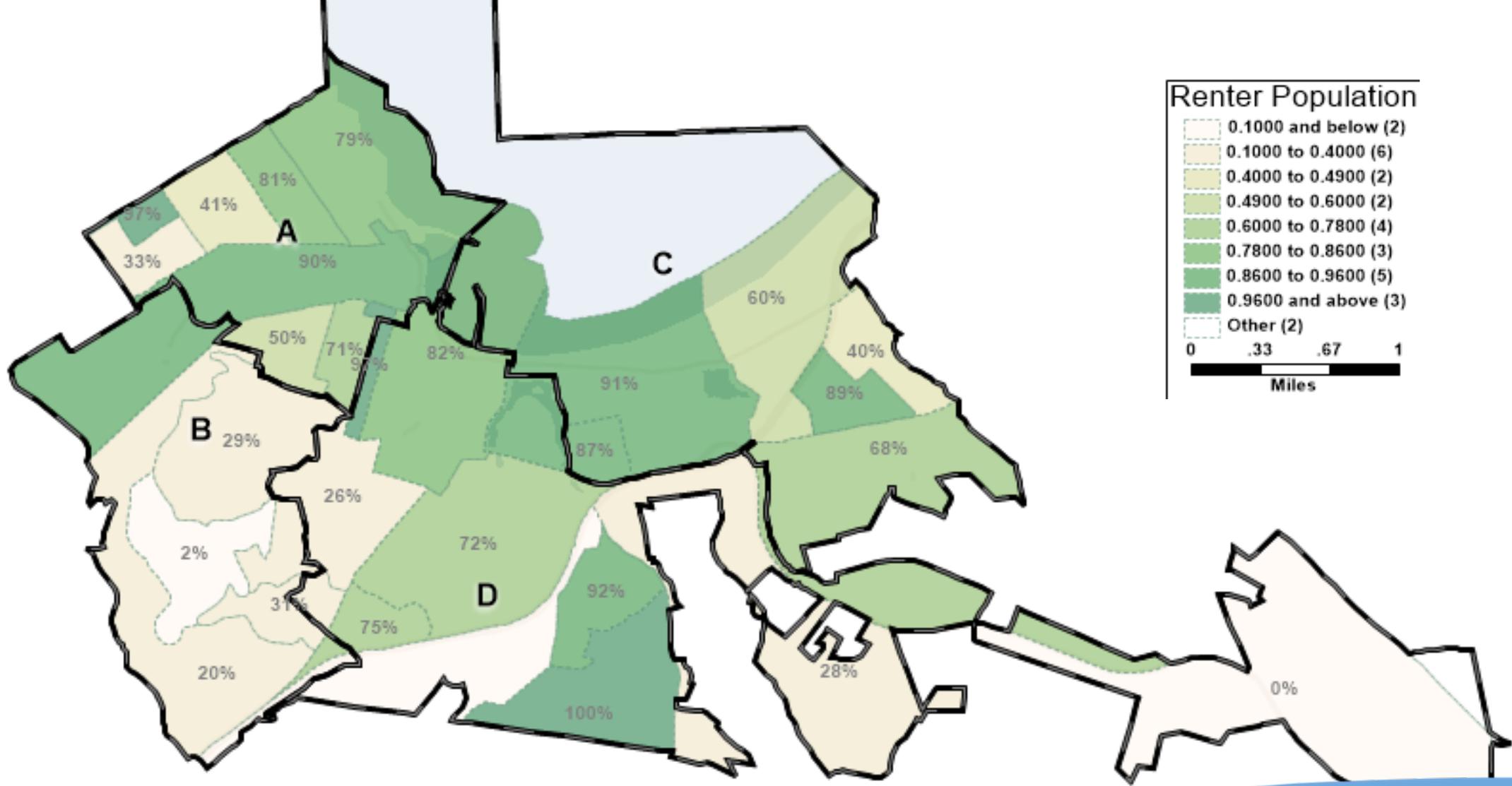

District Based Elections

At its [meeting on Tuesday, November 16, 2021](#), the City Council will consider adopting a Resolution of Intention to convert from the current at-large method of electing City Councilmembers to a by-district system. A proposed resolution would not change the structure of the City Council; instead it would start



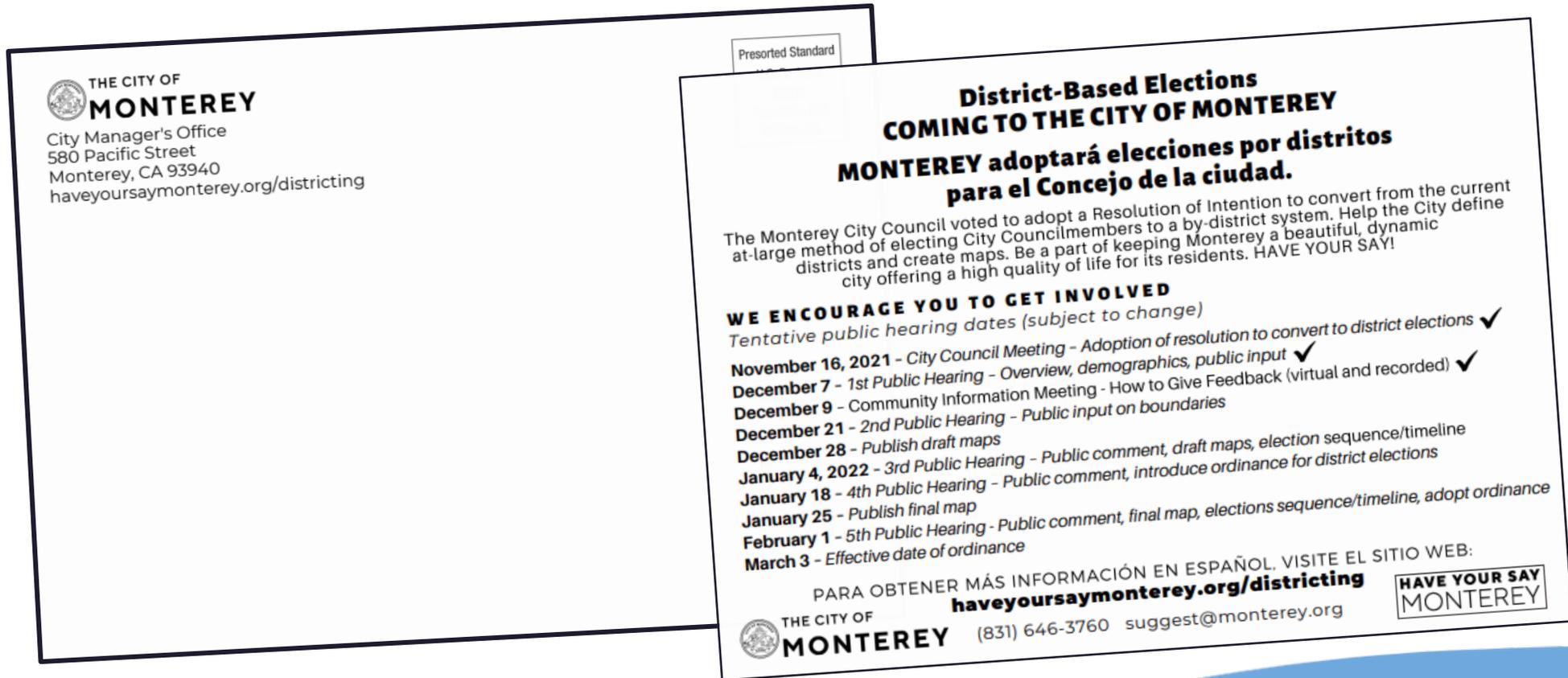
the process to implement a district based election system where the City is divided into separate geographical areas of equal population, composed of voters residing within the district which elect a representative who also resides within the district. With Council approval, City staff is required to complete the process by early February.

- Personas que viven en el centro de la ciudad o en un vecindario establecido
- Personas mayores
- Comunidades LGBTQIA+
- Estudiantes que viven cerca de los campus universitarios
- Poblaciones militares
- Residentes que comparten un idioma común
- Personas que utilizan los mismos sistemas de transporte

¿Qué criterios ayudarán al Ayuntamiento a comprender la importancia de su comunidad en el proceso de redistribución de distritos?

Al documentar su comunidad, es importante responder a las siguientes preguntas para ayudar al Ayuntamiento en el proceso de redistribución de distritos:

1. ¿Su comunidad tiene una cultura, características o vínculos compartidos?
2. ¿Su comunidad es de naturaleza geográfica? ¿Se puede localizar su comunidad en un mapa? ¿Existe densidad dentro de su comunidad?
3. Describa la relación de su comunidad con la ciudad y cómo se ve afectada por las decisiones políticas tomadas por el Ayuntamiento.

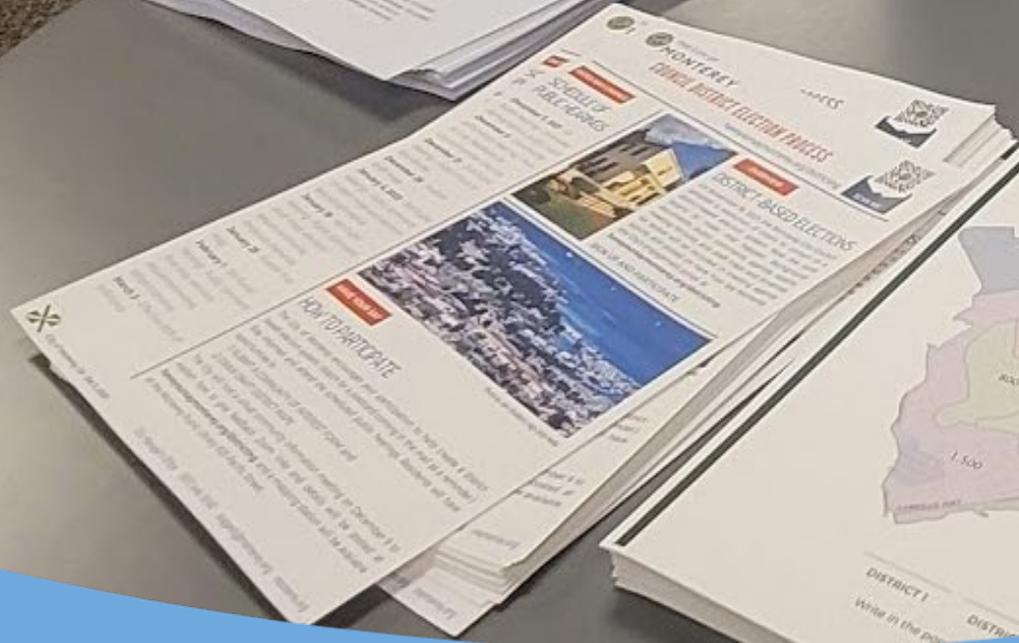
