

Silver	 Energy audits performed on city facilities and operations through SANDAG's Energy Roadmap program. 	01-2012
Gold	 Window replacements are planned for the Recreation Center. 	01-2012
	The city has retrofitted all traffic signals with green and red LED (light-emitting diode) lights.	01-2012
Platinum	 The city's new police station has a high-efficiency HVAC system. 	01-2012
	High efficiency induction street light replacements have been installed using ARRA funding.	01-2012
	Smart meters installed throughout city facilities that are more accurate and allow customers to view close to real-time data on their use.	01-2012

2. Water & Wastewater Systems

Level	Completed Activities	Reported
Silver	1. A <u>Fats</u> , <u>Oils</u> , <u>and Grease</u> (<u>FOG</u>) Control Program was implemented to help reduce blockages within the wastewater system which can lead to overflows and impact surface water quality. Staff enrolls food service establishments which are required to participate in the program and the majority of applicable establishments were issued a five-year FOG permit.	01-2012
Gold	 EDCO Waste and Recycling in La Mesa now accepts fats, oils and grease for free from the public to be recycled into biofuel by a local company in San Diego. 	01-2012
	 The city is actively upgrading the wastewater collection system to mitigate any storm water inflow or infiltration into the collection system. Reducing this burden on the treatment plant results in lower environmental impacts to the plant and the surrounding environment. 	01-2012
Platinum	Irrigation systems have been upgraded at all parks, several landscaped medians and most facilities resulting in more efficient water use.	01-2012
	 Information kiosks are located in four city parks as part of the city's storm water pollution prevention efforts. 	01-2012
	 Staff participates annually in the <u>Creek to Bay</u> <u>Cleanup and Coastal Cleanup Day</u> events. 	01-2012

Silver	 La Mesa has a Sustainable Building Task Force that includes representatives from various fields within the building industry and other groups to evaluate the feasibility of integrating sustainable building techniques into all new buildings as well as major retrofits. 	01-2012
Gold	 The new police station is in the process of achieving LEED Silver Certification. 	01-2012
	 Through the city's Development Review process, new development is encouraged to incorporate energy conservation and green building concepts at the early stages of project development. 	01-2012
Platinum	 Installed a cool roof on the La Mesa Community Center. 	01-2012
	 The city replaced older backup generators with cleaner, more energy-efficient units at the new Fire and Police facilities. 	01-2012
	 The city is working to implement a C&D online tracking system that actively assists projects in gaining LEED credits. 	01-2012

4. Waste Reduction & Recycling

Silver	 Using a grant from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) the city is distributing thousands of reusable recycling bags to multifamily complexes to help residents separate and carry recyclables to collection bins, along with space-saving can crushers and hundreds of recycling receptacles for common areas such as pools and laundry rooms. 	01-2012
Gold	 The city's mandatory recycling ordinance covers all sectors and has a community-wide compliance rate of 99%. 	01-2012
	2. In the most recent Annual Report to CalRecycle the 2010 estimated trash disposal rate by residents was 4.1 pounds/person/day (PPD) and 10.5 PPD by employees of local businesses. This is lower than the maximum disposal allowed in La Mesa, 6.2 PPD and 13.8 PPD respectively, under AB 939 which mandates 50% diversion from landfills.	01-2012
Platinum	 The city's waste and recycling hauler, now accepts all rigid plastics through its curbside collection to allow for more comprehensive recycling. 	01-2012
	Recycling containers are located in the downtown village as well as all city parks and facilities.	01-2012
	 An aerosol recycling system captures propellant for safe disposal. This is done by and for the city Public Works operations division. 	01-2012

Silver	 The city has a formal written policy in the city's Purchasing Manual for procurement of recycled products and sustainable purchasing is considered for all materials and items. 	01-2012
Gold	 All playground upgrades and replacement use recycled materials when available, including flooring materials that are either recycled tires or wood chips, depending on grant availability. 	01-2012
	The city has warehouse space devoted to used office equipment, supplies, and furniture for reuse by departments.	01-2012
Platinum	1. Periodic public auctions are held for surplus items.	01-2012
	Bidding for services and equipment are performed electronically whenever possible to save paper.	01-2012

Silver	 Solar powered radar feedback signs are used on two streets. 	01-2012
Gold	 Three city street lights have been converted to solar power. 	01-2012
	Solar powered smart parking meters are in use in the Downtown Village.	01-2012
Platinum	 Solar and renewable energy is encouraged in private development and several large projects are in place including retail and medical locations through a streamlined permitting process that allows faster and easier incorporation of these features. 	01-2012
	 The city owns four hybrid vehicles and as city vehicles are replaced, fuel efficiency and reduced emissions will be important criteria in selecting replacement vehicles and equipment. The city retrofitted six diesel vehicles to reduce emissions in compliance with the State's Tier 3 requirements and has three more to be installed with diesel particulate filters. Three additional diesel particulate filters are to be installed on off-road equipment to reduce emissions. 	01-2012

Silver	 Low-draw LED emergency lighting is being installed on all new public works vehicles, allowing the lights to be used without the engine running. Additionally, AIMS Fuelmaster automatic fuel monitoring devices, currently used on all emergency medical service vehicles, will be installed on all new vehicles and incrementally installed on existing vehicles. 	01-2012
Gold	 The city is working with SANDAG's iCommute program and the Metropolitan Transit System to encourage alternative transportation and carpool options through <u>Sustain La Mesa</u> and the annual environmental festival. 	01-2012
	 Walkability has been a focus of planning and design. Two mid-block crosswalks were constructed on Allison Avenue at the community library and trolley station and another at Grossmont Hospital which include sensor-activated flashing LED lights. 	01-2012
Platinum	 The city worked with developers and the transit authority to develop a <u>major multifamily residential</u> <u>project</u> at the Grossmont trolley station and staff worked with the San Diego Metropolitan Transit System to construct the new station on Alvarado Road along a major transit corridor. 	01-2012
	 The city is preparing a <u>Bicycle Master Plan</u> and Circulation Element update in accordance with AB 1358 "Complete Streets" legislation funded by a \$75,000 SANDAG grant awarded in July 2009. 	01-2012
	The city assisted in the planning and development of the EV Project, a nationwide pilot program to

Gold	 Existing policies reduce urban sprawl, preserve open space, and create a more compact urban community. The <u>Mixed Use Overlay Zone</u> supports compact 	01-2012
	urban development and pedestrian oriented neighborhoods.	01-2012
Platinum	1. A <u>Sidewalk Master Plan</u> is leading to new sidewalk construction where it is most needed, improving the walkability of the community. Construction of a new sidewalk, landscaped parkway and utility undergrounding was completed behind Helix Charter High School to increase walkability.	01-2012
	 The <u>University Avenue Revitalization</u> project is underway that will maximize walkability on this major commercial corridor and improve the streetscape. TBD 	01-2012

	 The city maintains 14 parks (approx. 1:4000 residents) and many include native vegetation such as the natural trails at Harry Griffen Regional Park. 	01-2012

The La Mesa FOCUS online publication includes various items on environmental topics throughout the year and information on various environmental topics is available through links to SDG&E, Helix Water District, EDCO, CalRecycle and the EPA.	01-2012
Gold	 Homeowners assistance is provided by the Building Department regarding ways to improve energy efficiency. 	01-2012
	 The Environmental Sustainability Commission is comprised of members from environmentally linked industries and the general public to address issues and establish guidelines related to climate change. 	01-2012
Platinum	 The "Sustain La Mesa" Environmental Festival is held annually in Harry Griffen Park, and includes dozens for booths and activities as well as expert speakers promoting a variety of environmental topics. The festival also features a recycling zone for electronic waste and hard to recycle materials including plastic wrap/bags and Styrofoam. 	01-2012
	 Presentations are made to schools for all grade levels under a contract with I Love A Clean San Diego to educate on topics of pollution prevention and recycling. 	01-2012
