Energy Efficiency and Conservation Activities

Silver

1. Maywood completed a street lighting retrofit project with SoCalREN in 2022.

1. The city hosted the Too Toxic to Trash Drive Thru Collection Event at Southeast Rio Vista YMCA.



	Silver
1.	The city enacted a construction and demolition recycling ordinance that complies with the state law. The Maywood municipal code requires at least 65% of material to be recycle or reused.

Climate-friendly Purchasing Activities

Silver

1. Maywood conducts monthly employee training to increase awareness of purchasing green products at Maywood City Hall

2. The city purchases recyclable or reusable green products such as cups, plates, and utensils.





Renewable Energy and Low-Carbon Fuels Activities

Silver

1. In 2022, Maywood adopted a renewable energy financing program PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) financing district, to help homeowners, multi-family dwellings and businesses install energy efficiency, water conservation, seismic retrofitting, electric vehicle charging, and fire resiliency projects on their properties.

2. The city worked with the Energy Coalition and the LA County Power Up Program to develop and implement electric vehicle charging infrastructure plan for the community at City Hall.

Efficient Transportation Activities

Silver

 The city received a 2020 ATP grant to fund a Bicycle Master Plan, Pedestrian Plan, and Safe Routes to School Plan. Project will be integrated into LA Metro's regional based Rail to (LA) River active transportation project.

- 3. Maywood is a member of Eco Rapid Transit. Eco-Rapid Transit, also known as the Orangeline Development Authority, is a joint powers authority (JPA) created to pursue development of a transit corridor that moves as rapidly as possible, uses grade separation as appropriate, and is environmentally friendly and energy efficient: https://local.nixle.com/alert/8990358/

Silver

1. The city ensures that landscaping requirements are maintained for commercial and residential projects.

2. Maywood parking requirements for higher density developments.

Open Space and Offsetting Carbon Emission Activities

Silver

1. Maywood received a 2017 Cal Fire Urban and Community Forestry Grant to support the planting and maintenance of nearly 700 trees.

- 2. Maywood received a 2022 Cal Fire Urban and Community Forestry Grant to support, Urban Forest Management UFMP, planting and maintenance of 200 trees.
