Silver	Began participating in PG&E's direct access program and began purchasing renewable energy from a third party provider accounting for 85% of the City of Monterey's energy use (2010).	2017

Gold	 Installed solar panels on an administrative building at 735 Pacific, offsetting all of its energy usage (2008). Acquired two electric vehicles through a grant from the Monterey Regional Air Pollution Control District (2014-2015). 	2017

Platinum	 Installed three public electric vehicle charging stations, two of which are Level 2 chargers (2013-2014). Became a member of Monterey Bay Community Power, a Community Choice Aggregate offering another choice to all energy ratepayers in Santa Cruz, San Benito and Monterey counties (2017). 	2017

Silver	All traffic signals replaced with LED lamps in 1998 - 1999. Wattage dropped from 150w incandescent to 13w LED for vehicle signals and from 69w incandescent to 8w LED for pedestrian indications.	2017

Gold	 All safety lighting on signal poles were changed from 250w HPS to 162w LED (2004). Bike boulevards established and bike lanes installed across the city (2010). 	2017

Platinum	Adaptive Control System installed on Lighthouse Avenue, reducing delay by 15% for 44,000 vehicles per day (2017).	2017
