Children's Health Insurance Information - Colorado

Colorado: Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+)

The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing administers the Medicaid and Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+) programs, as well as a variety of other programs for Colorado's low-income families, the elderly and people with disabilities.

Who Is Eligible?

A summary of eligibility requirements appears below. Be sure to check with the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to verify eligibility. Eligible individuals include:

- Children age 18 and younger and pregnant women age 19 and older;
- Applicants with household income under 200 percent of the federal poverty level (\$44,100 annually for a family of four in 2009 in Colorado);
- Colorado residents:
- Permanent legal residents who have had an Alien Registration number for at least five years, or are a refugee or an asylee;
- Applicants not eligible for Medicaid; and
- Applicants who do not have other health insurance.
