The Beacon Program is sponsored by the Institute for Local Government and the Statewide Energy Efficiency Collaborative (SEEC). SEEC is an alliance between three statewide non-profit organizations and California's four Investor-Owned Utilities. The Beacon Program is funded by California utility ratepayers and administered by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison and Southern California Gas Company under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission.







Energy Efficiency and Conservation Activities

Silver

1. All city facilities within Watsonville have been audited to identify energy efficiency opportunities, as well as potential for renewable energy production.

Gold

- 2. All city facilities have been benchmarked using the Portfolio Manager tool. This allows city staff to track energy usage and track the impacts that retrofits and behavior change campaigns are having.
- 3. The City of Watsonville has been working with partners in order to access technical assistance and financial incentives, including facility audits, rebates, and on-bill financing.























Water & Wastewater Systems **Activities**

Silver

1. The Watsonville wastewater treatment plant produces recycled water, which is used to irrigate 2,000 acres of row crops.

Gold

2. The City of Watsonville provides detailed information to the community regarding water conservation on its website. This information includes water conservation tips, information on a Lawn Conversion Rebate Program, and information on rebates for the installation of water efficient equipment.























Green Building Activities

Silver

1. The City of Watsonville is implementing a green building program and information about green building is found on a dedicated page of the website.

Gold

2. The City of Watsonville is part of the Hero Program, a Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Program, which allows community members to access loan funding to implement green building retrofits.

Efficient Transportation Activities

Silver

1. The City of Watsonville provides detailed information about the numerous recreation trails on the website. This information includes a detailed trail map as well as a promotional video.

Gold

- 2. The City of Watsonville works with local partners, such as the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Agency, to conduct studies and implement projects designed to decrease traffic and promote active transportation.
- 3. The City of Watsonville is part of AMBAG, the federally designated MPO for the Monterey, San Benito and Santa Cruz counties. The City of Watsonville uses the transportation model provided by AMBAG which includes different modes of transportation (bicycling, private vehicles, public transit).























Land Use and Community Design Activities

Silver

1. The Watsonville city council approved an expenditure plan in 2017 for seven transportation projects, which include the construction of a new bicycle lane as well as safety improvements for existing bike lanes.

Gold

2. The City of Watsonville is partnering with AMBAG to work on a Sustainable Communities Strategy, as part of SB 375.
